Abstract

Management of complex cases is a painstaking process based on problem-oriented treatment planning. Executing this plan with proficiency dictates the effective collaboration between various dental disciplines. This case illustrates the detailed management of a 27-year-old Saudi male patient with high caries risk factors. Other distinct findings include; missing, carious, super-erupted teeth and several substandard root canal treatments.

Introduction

The success of functional and esthetic restorations in a case requiring full mouth rehabilitation is often dependent on our understanding of interdisciplinary concepts. With every patient being unique and representing a special blend of age, personality characteristics as well as expectations, our knowledge of interdisciplinary concepts can open a whole range of treatment options and outcomes.
